The first year at IICLO

Miyakawa Takeo, Chief Director

A year has passed since I became a chief director of IICLO on July 1, 2015, so I have experienced a whole year of the work the IICLO does.

I attended a surprisingly informal directors' meeting, at which I was officially appointed chief director. This impression of pleasant informality, frankness and constructive discussion has not



changed since my appointment. The IICLO board consists of a member of the Osaka Prefecture Board of Education, a librarian, a school master, a member of the home library association, a publisher, an author and a researcher. Their opinions coupled with their professional backgrounds mean that they are concerned rather with the future of children's books than the management of one foundation, and the meeting is a great place to learn and exchange new information about children's books and culture. I am very happy to be a part of this company.

In November, co-sponsored by the Kinran Foundation, the ceremony of the 15th International Grimm Award, was held. Professor Perry Nodelman from Canada gave a very interesting lecture called "Before and Beyond *Words About Pictures*: Picture Books and Picture-Book Studies, Then and Now".

In March, 2016, I attended the ceremony of the 32nd Nissan Children's Storybook and Picture book Grand Prix at Nissan Motor Cooperation Headquarters. Before the ceremony, a seminar on creative writing for the awardees was held by the judges. It is held every year and I could see the judges' intention to support fresh writers. At the party after the ceremony, I felt the warmth of staff of

Nissan Motor Cooperation, which has supported this project for a long time.

Our foundation keeps working hard by holding lectures by researchers from oversea, organizing events for children and research projects, putting more information on the internet site for children's books, publishing a bulletin and mail-magazines and registering donated materials from publishers.

I live in Tokyo and receive emails from IICLO (Osaka) office almost every day. These pile up pretty quickly and so I schedule a trip to Osaka in order to meet and discuss face to face the issues they refer to that will coincide with some of the exciting events organized by IICLO.

Over six years have passed since the difficult circumstances in which the re-start of IICLO took place. The former chief director, Miyake Okiko, board members, and the staff are making great efforts to run IICLO. I would like to thank all of you for your warm support and ask for your continued assistance.

15th International Brothers Grimm Award Presented to Professor Perry Nodelman

The International Brothers Grimm Award is presented by the International Institute for Children's Literature, Osaka and the Kinran-kai Foundation and Osaka Prefectural Otemae Senior High School Alumni Kinran-kai every other year to an individual who has contributed significantly to the international progress of the research of children's literature.

The 15th award in 2015 was presented to Professor Perry Nodelman at Winnipeg University in Canada and an award presentation ceremony and a commemorative lecture were held.

<Reason for the award>

Dr. Perry Nodelman, Professor emeritus of University of Winnipeg is an exemplary researcher of children's literature and picture books from around the world.

His main works published in book form are; Words About Pictures: The Narrative Art of Children's Picture Books (1988), The Pleasures of Children's Literature (1992), and The Hidden Adult: Defining Children's Literature (2008), all of which are highly esteemed. Words About Pictures: The Narrative Art of Children's Picture Books in particular has



received international recognition as a groundbreaking work in the field of research on picture books. *The Pleasures of Children's Literature* is renowned as a textbook for the research of children's literature for university students and has been translated for publication in China, Taiwan and Korea.

He was editor of the *Children's Literature* Association Quarterly for five years (1983-87) and the CCL/LCJ, the Canadian children's literature journal for five years (2004-2008). He has also written many articles on children's literature theory and reviews of research books on children's literature, all of which have contributed to the development of research in children's literature.

In Canada, Professor Nodelman taught at the University of Winnipeg for thirty seven years and provided valuable support to many researchers.

He is also a writer of both children and young adult's fiction and has published twelve books. Among these, the four books of the *Minds Series* written with Carol Matas, are works of fantasy which encourage logical thinking and have been translated into Japanese. They can be said to be the

putting into practice of his theories on children's literature.

<Outline of the Commemorative Lecture>

Professor Nodelman summarized his book *Words* About Pictures -which is pioneer work of research into picture books- by introducing some picture books as examples. Then, the new wave of picture books such as graphic novels and the medium of electronic devices were discussed, -with many visual examples- as the basis for research for a new work on picture books.

The images helped the audience understand the changes picture books have gone through, from classics to modern, and the lecture analyzed picture books from a number of research view points.
